Keynote speakers



Daniel Ferreira is Head of Department and Professor of Finance at the London School of Economics. He is known for his academic work on corporate governance, especially on the workings of corporate boards, having written several influential articles on the topic. More generally, his research interests span areas such as corporate finance, organizations, business strategy, and microeconomics, with articles published in leading academic journals (*Journal of Finance, Journal of Financial Economics, Review of Financial Studies, Journal of Accounting and Economics, Management Science, Review of Economic Studies, RAND Journal of Economics*). His academic work is policy relevant and has had significant media impact, being covered by *The Wall Street Journal, The Financial Times*, and *The Economist,* amongst others. He has also offered expert advice to businesses, governments, and organizations, including the UK House of Commons, HM Treasury, the European Commission, the Bank of England, the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, and Norges Bank Investment Management. Daniel was awarded a PhD degree in Economics from the University of Chicago in 2002.



Christophe Pérignon is Professor of Finance and Associate Dean for Research at HEC Paris, France. He is also the co-holder of the ACPR (Banque de France) Chair in Regulation and Systemic Risk. He holds a PhD in Finance from the Swiss Finance Institute and has been a Post-Doctoral Fellow at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA). Prior to joining HEC Paris, he was an Assistant Professor of Finance at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, Canada. His areas of research and teaching interests are in derivatives markets, financial risk management, and artificial intelligence/machine learning. Christophe's research has been published in top finance *Journal of Finance, Journal of Financial Economics, Review of Financial Studies*) and in general-science journals (*Science*). In 2014, he received the Europlace Award for the Best Young Researcher in Finance. As an open-science evangelist, he contributed to develop innovative tools to help fellow researchers to make their research easier to use and to reproduce: in 2012, he co-founded RunMyCode.org, an academic website allowing researchers to share the code and data associated with their scientific papers; in 2019, he launched cascad, the first Certification Agency for Scientific Code and Data.
